Results can only be regarded as preliminary screening or as an aid to diagnosis and cannot be considered conclusive evidence to the presence or absence of gastrointestinal bleeding or pathology. Certain medications may cause gastrointestinal irritation leading to occult bleeding. This may be a false positive test result. A negative result can be obtained even when a GI disorder is present, as not all polyps or colorectal cancers bleed or may bleed intermittently. Iron-rich supplements have been associated with false positive results. Ingestion of high doses (>250 mg/day) of vitamin C (ascorbic acid) have been linked to false negative results.
